My personal and professional ambition is to bring about social and economic justice for those who may feel excluded from their community.

A qualified counsellor and experienced trainer on disability issues, I have over thirty years' experience of providing support, advice, guidance and advocacy to disabled people on employment, education, training and benefits.



In the past I have edited and owned online newspapers focusing on disability, equality and inclusion.

I have recently started broadcasting a programme on disability and equality issues on LCR 106.7 fm, and am in the process of producing a podcast covering equality, minority or community issues.





I use my own 'lived experience' of disability to help other people. We all have a right to participate equally in society; I want to use my skills, knowledge and experience to help other disabled people to access the services and opportunities they are entitled to.
