He hired me as a social worker and I am grateful that he gave me the chance to work even if I had no experience.

I wanted to learn and prove to them that I can work like a normal person. I currently work for the National Association of the Deaf in Romania and I am also the vice president of the Association.



My dream is to show others that I succeeded too, even if at the beginning it was difficult and with barriers.
